Agricultural Exhibition Center Rules

All exhibits must be pre-entered. Entry forms must be postmarked by August 15th, 2017

The Agricultural Exhibition Center will be open to accept entries in all categories except flowers, fruits, vegetables on Saturday September 9th 12pm – 7pm, Sunday September 10th 11am-4pm for flowers, fruits, vegetables and Tuesday September 12th 4pm-7pm for baked goods. NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED, nor will items dropped off at times other than those listed. Items sent VIA UPS, Fed-Ex or US Mail will be returned. Entry forms must have been mailed by August 15th. Entries not filled out properly will be returned. Please use a separate entry form for each person entering. No entry confirmation letters will be sent. Absolutely only one entry in each lot will be allowed. Grange Exhibits will be accepted and in place by 4pm – Sunday September 10th before the start of the Fair. Items previously exhibited here are not eligible for premiums. All items must be made by the person under whose name they are exhibited. Care will be taken to prevent loss or damage but under no circumstances will the Oxford Fair be responsible for any injury or loss that may occur. Entries must be considered worthy of a premium or none will be awarded. Items must be completed in the year they are exhibited. If conditions warrant additional ribbons may be awarded.

The Agricultural Exhibition Center will be open daily from September 13^{th} to September 16^{th} 9am – 9 pm . All exhibits to be removed on the Sunday (September 17^{th}) following the close of the Fair from Noon – 2 pm. Any items not picked up will be brought to the Main Office. You will need to call 207-739-2204 to make arrangements for pick-up. If not picked up by October 1, 2017 premium will be forfeited and you will be banned from entering the following year.

Hall Attendants may refuse items not acceptable for exhibit.

All Exhibits are open to Maine residents.

All Exhibits open to juniors up to age 18. Premiums will be slightly less unless otherwise stated.

Please specify age on the entry form in the space provided and add a "Y" after each lot #.

Premiums will be paid on or before December 31st, 2017 as funds are available.

Department 28 Fruits, Vegetables, Pumpkins

Uniformity in size, shape, color and maturity is important. Entries should not be soft and under mature or tough and over mature. Entries should be clean of soil but not scrubbed, and free of blemishes or damage caused by insects, disease or mechanical means. (Table size of edible vegetables is preferred.) Please use care when filling out the entry form. You may enter only the items listed and only one item in the "other" category. For junior entries please use "Y" after each lot number. Junior entries will be judged separately. Please indicate the child's age in the space provided on the entry form. Use a separate entry form for each person entering. Adults in the same household may not enter the same items. The only exception to this will be in Class B. No individual entries will be allowed if you are entering a Family or Farm display. Because of space limitations we regret we must limit individual entries to 20 items. Entry forms must be mailed by August 20th. Entries must have the proper quantity in a lot to be judged. 

Old-Fashioned Apple Cake with Brown Sugar Frosting

At a Glance Prep 20 mins. to 30 mins. Bake 42 mins. to 47 mins.

- 2 1/3 cups King Arthur Unbleached All-Purpose Flour or
- 1 2/3 cups granulated sugar
- 2 teaspoons baking soda
- 3/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 1/2 teaspoons or 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon + 1/4 teaspoon each ground ginger and ground nutmeg
- 2 large eggs
- 1/2 cup (8 tablespoons) unsalted butter, softened
- 4 cups peeled, cored, chopped apple, about 1 1/3 pounds whole apples
- 1 cup diced toasted walnuts or pecans

Frosting

- 7 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 2/3 cup brown sugar
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 cup milk
- 2 1/4 cups confectioners' sugar
- 3/4 teaspoon vanilla extract or 1/4 teaspoon
- Directions
- 1. Preheat the oven to 325°F. Grease and flour a 9" x 13" pan.
- 2. To make the cake: Mix all of the ingredients except the apples and nuts in a large bowl.
- 3. Beat until well combined; the mixture will be very stiff, and may even be crumbly.
- 4. Add the apples and nuts, and mix until the apples release some of their juice and the stiff mixture becomes a thick batter, somewhere between cookie dough and brownie batter in consistency.
- 5. Spread the batter in the prepared pan, smoothing it with your wet fingers.
- 6. Bake the cake for 45 minutes, or until a cake tester or toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean, or with just a few wet crumbs clinging to it.
- 7. Remove the cake from the oven and place it on a rack to cool completely; don't remove the cake from the pan.
- 8. To make the frosting: Melt the butter in a small pan over medium heat. Stir in the brown sugar and salt and cook, stirring, until the sugar melts.
- 9. Add the milk, bring to a boil, and pour into a mixing bowl to cool for 10 minutes.
- 10. After 10 minutes, stir in the confectioners' sugar and vanilla. Beat well; if the mixture appears too thin, add more confectioners' sugar. Spread on the cake while frosting is still warm.
- 11. Yield: about 2 dozen servings.

Chocolate Chip Oatmeal Cookies



These are soft and chewy, packed with chips, and go beyond the standard chocolate chip cookie with the addition of nutty tasting oats Our thanks to the <u>Cookies for Kids' Cancer</u> non-profit, the originator of this recipe, from King Arthur And finally, for those of you baking gluten-free, enjoy our recipe for <u>Gluten-Free Chocolate Chip Oatmeal Cookies</u>.

- 1 cup (16 tablespoons) unsalted butter, at room temperature
- 1 cup light brown sugar, packed
- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- 1 large egg, at room temperature
- 1 large egg yolk, at room temperature
- 1 tablespoon vanilla extract
- 2 cups Unbleached All-Purpose Flour
- · 1 cup quick-cooking or old-fashioned oats
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon kosher salt or 3/4 teaspoon regular table salt
- · 3 cups semisweet chocolate chips

Directions

1. Preheat the oven to 325°F. Line several cookie sheets with parchment paper, or lightly grease with non-stick vegetable oil spray.

- 2. Beat together the butter and sugars until smooth.
- 3. Add the egg, egg yolk, and vanilla one at a time, beating well after each.
- 4. Whisk together the flour, oats, baking powder, baking soda, and salt, and add to the butter mixture in the bowl.
- 5. Mix until everything is thoroughly incorporated. Scrape the bottom and sides of the bowl, and mix briefly.
- 6. Stir in the chocolate chips.
- Decide what size cookies you want to make. A <u>muffin scoop</u> (1/4 cup) will make 20 large, palm-sized cookies. A <u>tablespoon</u> <u>cookie scoop</u> (4 teaspoons) will make 50 medium (2 3/4» to 3») cookies; and a <u>teaspoon cookie scoop</u> (2 teaspoons) will make 100 small (2 1/2») cookies.
- 8. Scoop the dough onto the prepared baking sheets, leaving about 1 1/2" to 2" between cookies.
- 9. Bake the cookies for 12 to 17 minutes, until they're a light golden brown, with slightly darker edges. Their middles may still look a tiny bit shiny; that's OK, they'll continue to bake as they cool on the pan.
- 10. Remove the cookies from the oven, and as soon as they're set enough to handle, transfer them to racks to cool.
- 11. Yield: 20 to 100 cookies, depending on size.

• Feel free to substitute a 1-pound bag of chocolate chips for the 18 ounces (3 cups) called for.
