Oxford Fair Youth Code of Conduct

As a participant in the youth program, I understand that I represent myself, my family, my county, Maine and all Maine participants, volunteers, and staff.

Therefore, by my signature below, I agree to:

- 1. Participate fully in this program.
- 2. Follow all schedule times, including curfew and wake up hours, and to be where assigned and when assigned.
- 3. Follow the dress code which is: be neat, clean, and presentable.
 - a. Tan or green full length pants--NEW
 - b. White: collared and button front shirt (polo shirt is acceptable--NEW
 - c. NO sneakers
 - d. NO clothing that advertises farm/breed
 - e. Clothing that superintendent deems inappropriate for event.
- 4. Uphold the highest standards of behavior, manners, and language.
- 5. Refrain from using alcoholic beverages, non-prescribed or illegal drugs, tobacco products and firearms/fireworks.
- 6. Always respect the rights of others and make every attempt to include all participants in all activities.
- 7. Leave the facilities in the same or better condition than I found them when I arrived.
- 8. Support and follow all leadership and direction received from coordinators, chaperones, and any other adult authority.
- 9. Respect the personal space and property of others in all setting including during overnight programs.
- 10. Seek assistance and support from adult chaperones on behalf of myself or others should a situation arise that warrants adult intervention or makes me feel uncomfortable.

I understand that should I break this agreement, I must accept the consequences of my actions, which might include loss of privileges during this program, loss of privileges in the future, and / or immediate dismissal from this program.

We must receive your application (indicates you have read and agree to this Code of Conduct), along with a copy of your proof of insurance and W9 form by August 15th.

Dept 10: Youth Market Lamb Show and Sale

You must submit proof of liability insurance in the amount of \$1,000,000 (One Million Dollars)

Judging of lambs will be on Thursday at 3pm. The Youth Lamb Sale will be held on Friday at the Oxford County Fairgrounds, beginning at 9am. You must agree to sell your lamb/s at the auction to participate in the show. All youth show lambs that are sold at the Oxford Fair must be raised at the youth's home premises.

The show and the sale will be for the Oxford County Agricultural Society area or approved by the screening committee.

Lambs will be weighed first. They must have been purchased by June 1. They may be either grade purebred or withers. They must weigh 80 pounds or more and be docked, castrated, washed, dried, and slick sheared before weighing in at the fairgrounds to be allowed to show. NO WET LAMBS WILL BE WEIGHED.

Lambs will be accepted on Wednesday at 7:00 am or before. Lambs will be weighed at 7am Thursday. Feed MUST be out at 7pm on Wednesday, NO exceptions.

The judge may excuse any lamb, regardless of weight, if the lamb is not up to quality standards.

Showmanship is mandatory. Classes will be Senior, Intermediate, Junior and Novice.

Rosettes will be awarded in each class.

Youth are limited to 1 lamb per exhibitor.

Showmanship will pay on the Danish system.

Hogs must have been purchased by June 1.

Hogs will be accepted on Wednesday at 7:00 am or before. Hogs will be weighed on Thursday at 7am. Feed MUST be out at 7pm on Wednesday, NO exceptions.

The judge may excuse any hog, regardless of weight, if the hog is not up to quality standards.

Showmanship is mandatory. Classes will be Senior, Intermediate, Junior and Novice.

Rosettes will be awarded in each class.
