Agricultural Exhibition Center Rules

All exhibits must be pre-entered. Entry forms must be postmarked by August 15th

The Agricultural Exhibition Center will be open to accept items in all categories except flowers, fruits, and vegetables on the Saturday preceding the Fair from 12pm – 7pm, Sunday preceding the Fair from 11am-4pm for flowers, fruits, and vegetables and Tuesday preceding the Fair from 4pm-7pm for baked goods. NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED, nor will items dropped off at times other than those listed.

Items sent VIA UPS, Fed-Ex or US Mail will be returned.

Entry forms must have been mailed by August 15th.

Entries not filled out properly will be returned.

Please use a separate entry form for each person entering.

No entry confirmation letters will be sent.

Absolutely only one entry in each lot will be allowed.

Grange Exhibits will be accepted and in place by 4pm – Sunday preceding the Fair.

Items previously exhibited here are not eligible for premiums.

All items must be made by the person under whose name they are exhibited.

Care will be taken to prevent loss or damage but under no circumstances will the Oxford Fair be responsible for any injury or loss that may occur.

Entries must be considered worthy of a premium or none will be awarded.

Items must be completed in the year they are exhibited.

If conditions warrant additional ribbons may be awarded.

The Agricultural Exhibition Center will be open daily from Wednesday to Saturday 9am – 9 pm.

All exhibits to be removed on the Sunday following the close of the Fair from Noon – 2 pm.

Any items not picked up will be brought to the Main Office. You will need to call 207-739-2204 to make arrangements for pick-up. If not picked up by October 1 premium will be forfeited and you will be banned from entering the following year.

Hall Attendants may refuse items not acceptable for exhibit.

All Exhibits are open to Maine residents.

All Exhibits open to juniors up to age 18. Premiums will be slightly less unless otherwise stated.

Please specify age on the entry form in the space provided and add a “Y” after each lot #.

Premiums will be paid on or before December 31st as funds are available.

Fruits, Vegetables, Pumpkins

Uniformity in size, shape, color and maturity is important. Entries should not be soft and under mature or tough and over mature. Entries should be clean of soil but not scrubbed, and free of blemishes or damage caused by insects, disease or mechanical means. (Table size of edible vegetables is preferred.) Please use care when filling out the entry form. You may enter only the items listed and only one item in the “other” category. For junior entries please use “Y” after each lot number. Junior entries will be judged separately. Please indicate the child’s age in the space provided on the entry form. Use a separate entry form for each person entering. Adults in the same household may not enter the same items. The only exception to this will be in Class B. No individual entries will be allowed if you are entering a Family or Farm display. Because of space limitations we regret we must limit individual entries to 20 items. Entry forms must be mailed by August 15th. Entries must have the proper quantity in a lot to be judged. Under other categories please list variety if known. **NO LARGE ZUCCHINI.** Premiums paid will be as follows:



Pumpkin Chocolate Chip Cookies

Pumpkin and chocolate chips make a great pair for Halloween. Add some strategically placed chips when the cookies come out of the oven for eyes, then drizzle the glaze for stripes, and you have the perfect party snack without a lot of fuss. For more grownup tastes, add the optional orange zest.

Ingredients

Cookies

- 2 1/4 cups (269g) King Arthur Unbleached All-Purpose Flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 1/2 teaspoons cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon ginger
- 16 tablespoons (227g) unsalted butter, softened
- 1/2 cup (106g) brown sugar, packed
- 1/2 cup (99g) granulated sugar
- 2 scant cups (425g) or one 15-ounce can pumpkin purée
- 2 large eggs
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- grated rind (zest) of 1 orange, optional
- 2 cups (340g) semisweet chocolate chips
- 1 cup (113g) chopped walnuts

Glaze (optional)

- 1 1/2 cups (170g) confectioners' sugar
- 2 1/2 tablespoons (35g) milk
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract

Instructions

- To make the cookies:** Preheat the oven to 375°F. Lightly grease two baking sheets, or line them with parchment paper.
- Whisk together the flour, baking powder, soda, salt, and spices in a medium bowl.
- In a separate bowl, beat together the butter and sugars. Scrape down the sides of the bowl, and beat briefly, just until smooth.
- Add the pumpkin, eggs, vanilla, and orange zest, beating to blend.
- Slowly add the dry ingredients, beating to blend. Stir in the chocolate chips and walnuts.
- Using a tablespoon cookie scoop or soup spoon, drop the dough onto the prepared baking sheets in 1 1/4" balls. Bake them on the middle oven rack for about 18 minutes, until the edges are lightly browned. Remove the cookies from the oven, and let them cool on the baking sheets 5 minutes before transferring them to racks.
- If desired, press two chocolate chips into each warm cookie to make eyes for the pumpkin.
- To make the glaze:** Stir together the sugar, milk and vanilla until the glaze is smooth. Dip the tops of the cookies in the glaze; or drizzle the glaze over the cookies.
- Place the cookies back on the rack for the glaze to set. Wrap loosely, and store for several days at room temperature; freeze for longer storage.



Lemon Bliss Cake

Our **2017 Recipe of the Year** is a lovely golden lemon cake, extra-moist and nicely tangy due to its fresh lemon juice glaze. Baking this cake in a Bundt pan turns it from everyday to special-occasion, perfect for everything from birthday parties to an elegant dinner. Our thanks to the late Maida Heatter, grande dame of delicious desserts, for the inspiration behind this recipe.



PREP

Ingredients

Cake

16 tablespoons (227g) unsalted butter*, at room temperature, at least 65°F

2 cups (397g) granulated sugar
1 teaspoon salt

4 large eggs, at room temperature

2 teaspoons baking powder

3 cups (361g) King Arthur Unbleached All-Purpose Flour

1 cup (227g) milk, whole milk preferred, at room temperature
finely grated rind of 2 medium lemons or 3/4 teaspoon lemon oil

1/4 cup (24g) almond flour, for dusting baking pan, optional

*If you use salted butter, reduce the salt in the recipe to 3/4 teaspoon.

Glaze

1/3 cup (74g) freshly squeezed lemon juice, the juice of about 1 1/2 juicy lemons

3/4 cup (149g) granulated sugar

Icing (optional)

Instructions

- ① Preheat the oven to 350°F.
- ② Beat together the butter, sugar, and salt, first until combined, then until fluffy and lightened in color. For a visual of what this should look like, see our video, how to cream butter and sugar.
- ③ Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition. Scrape the sides and bottom of the bowl once all the eggs have been added, and beat briefly to re-combine any residue.
- ④ Measure the flour by gently spooning it into a cup, then sweeping off any excess. Whisk the baking powder into the flour. Add the flour mixture to the batter in three parts alternately with the milk, starting and ending with the flour. The batter may look slightly curdled when you add the milk. That's OK; it'll smooth out as you add the flour. Mix until everything is well combined; the batter will look a bit rough, but shouldn't have any large lumps. Stir in the grated lemon rind or lemon oil.
- ⑤ Thoroughly grease a 10- to 12-cup Bundt pan. Spoon the batter into the prepared pan, leveling it and smoothing the top with a spatula.
- ⑥ Bake the cake for 45 to 60 minutes, or until a cake tester or toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean. A pan with a dark interior will bake cake more quickly; start checking at 40 minutes.
- ⑦ While the cake is baking, make the glaze by stirring together the lemon juice and sugar. Microwave or heat over a burner briefly, stirring to dissolve the sugar. You don't want to cook the lemon juice, so microwave just until very warm, but not uncomfortably hot — less than 1 minute should do it. Set the glaze aside.
- ⑧ Remove the cake from the oven, and carefully run a knife between cake and pan all around the edge. Place the pan upside down on a cooling rack. If the cake drops out of the pan onto the rack, remove

1 1/2 cups (170g) confectioners' sugar, sifted
pinch of salt
2 to 3 tablespoons (28g to 43g) freshly squeezed lemon juice

the pan. If the cake doesn't drop onto the rack, let it rest for 5 minutes, then carefully lift the pan off the cake. If the cake still feels like it's sticking, give it another 5 minutes upside down, then very gently shake the pan back and forth to loosen and remove it.

- ⑨ Brush the glaze all over the hot cake, both top and sides. Let it sink in, then brush on more glaze, continuing until all the glaze is used up.
- ⑩ Allow the cake to cool completely before icing and serving.
- ⑪ To ice the cake, mix the sugar and salt, then mix in 2 tablespoons of the lemon juice, adding just enough additional juice to create a thick glaze, one that's just barely pourable. Drizzle it artfully over the completely cool cake.
- ⑫ **Storage information:** Store the cake, well wrapped, at room temperature for several days. Freeze for longer storage.

Tips from our Bakers

- ☆ Want to make this recipe into 20 standard-size cupcakes? Line 20 wells of a couple of muffin pans with papers; grease the papers. Scoop the batter into the wells, using a slightly heaping 1/4 cup for each. Bake the cupcakes in a preheated 350°F oven for about 25 minutes, until a toothpick inserted into the center of one comes out clean. Put the glaze in a small bowl, and dip the top of each cake into the glaze repeatedly, until the glaze is used up. Add icing if desired.
- ☆ Bundt pans that have an intricate design, or older pans that aren't non-stick, need to be carefully greased in order to ensure your cake comes out of the pan intact. Melted vegetable shortening applied with a pastry brush is your best bet for a "challenging" pan.
- ☆ For stronger lemon flavor, use the grated rind of 2 lemons + 1/2 teaspoon lemon oil.
